If you think **DON MARSH** looks familiar, that's because he was a reporter, producer and anchorman at KTVI-TV, St. Louis, Missouri, for more than 20 years. Before coming to St. Louis, Don went to Middlebury College, Upsala College, and the University of Bonn. After college, he worked as a journalist in Frankfort, Germany; Orange, NJ; and Baltimore, MD. Besides working in front of the camera, Don also worked in front of the classroom, teaching Broadcast Journalism at both Maryville College and St. Louis Community College.

Don has won 12 Regional Emmy Awards for writing, reporting, and producing. He was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

Don's book, *Flash Frames*, is a memoir of his 50 years in journalism and covers a career that began in 1959. It is not a textbook, but rather a series of interesting, humorous and historic vignettes covering a wide array of experiences with international events such as the Cold War in Europe, John F. Kennedy's visit to Germany, James Earl Ray's capture in London, Spiro Agnew's accidental success in politics, the Civil Rights struggle and overseas assignments, not to mention his many years covering Missouri politics and assorted regional happenings. He has covered a wide array of pop culture personalities from Frank Sinatra to Henry Fonda, to Miss Nude America.
