Green, author of *Dad's War with the United States Marines*, as he tells how he compiled the memories contained in 400 letters his father wrote from the South Pacific during World War II, along with his own childhood memories, and wrote a family tale that relates the exploits of his dad, PFC Ben Green, a resourceful nonconformist who, despite having a wife and two small children, enlisted at the venerable age of 35.
